CONFERENCE UPDATE



For the health and safety of our speakers, sponsors, attendees and team, we have decided to change our in-person 2022 Women of Isenberg Conference, to a Virtual Conference. Our entire programming will officially be moved online to Zoom.

The Women of Isenberg mission has always been to provide informative and inspiring content, as well as foster connections in a community of alumni, students, sponsors and faculty. This goal will still be achieved in a virtual setting and we truly believe that the safest way to stay true to this goal is by transitioning to an online environment and therefore mitigating all potential Covid risk.

We want to be clear that this decision is on behalf of the Women of Isenberg Planning Committee (students and Advisors), and it is not indicative of the University's policies. We are thrilled to be heading back to in-person classes where masks can be worn and vaccination statuses confirmed. Our usual in-person conference is a robust event, with so many attendees

traveling from in and out of state, as well as multiple meals and refreshments (enjoyed unmasked).



SHANTEL LACION SHALACION NOTE

We are thrilled to announce our keynote speaker for the 2022 Wol Conference: Shantel Palacio! In past Wol Conferences, Shantel has joined us as a panelist speaker, and we are incredibly excited to have her kick off the conference this year as keynote!

Shantel is the Principal Advisor at Urbane University and a consulting partner at the Perception Institute. She has served as both a project manager and chief advisor to governmental leaders and spent nearly ten years executing both mayoral and chancellor's initiatives at NYC's Department of Education. Additionally, she consults public and private entities on implementing diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives.

Palacio co-authored her first publication, The Economic Impact of Investment in Public Higher Education in Massachusetts, in 2012 as a grad student. It has since received several citations, including Harvard's IOP. Recently, she co-authored Falsifying Teacher Absences, published in West's Education Law Reporter.

Shantel is also passionate about combating low expectation stereotypes in her hometown of Brownsville, NY and founded Brownsvillain LLC. Her work was featured on NPR's All Things Considered in 2018. She was awarded the Independent Film Project's 2019 Documentary Fellowship for co-producing Million Dollar Block, which examines the institutions of public housing, public education, and the criminal justice system through the eyes of its residents. Last October, she was invited by GQ Japan to publish an article about her community in its first-ever Global Edition.

Palacio earned a Bachelor's degree in Communication from Bryant University, a Master's in Public Policy from the University of Massachusetts Amherst, and is currently a doctoral candidate in Leadership and Policy Studies at the University of New Hampshire.

Below is a selection of some of the panels and their descriptions that will be held during the 2022 Wol Virtual Conference in February! Stay updated on our social media to read about all of the panels that will take place.

INVESTING IN YOURSELF

The key towards achieving your personal and professional goals is learning how to invest in yourself. In a world full of change and uncertainty, the one person in your life that you can count on most is yourself. Panelists will share their experiences where they have believed in themselves while it felt like everything was rooting against them. Attendees will hear about how to handle burnout, balancing work life and personal life, and taking care of your everyday mental health. The mission of this panel is to inspire attendees to courageously take risks to benefit themselves and their careers in the long run.

THE NEW TECHNOLOGICAL LANDSCAPE

This panel will explore how technology impacts occupations in all types of fields. Panelists will address how to leverage technology in a way that is beneficial to your career whether working with future employers, peers, managers, clients or business partners. They will discuss how it has helped them navigate through the pandemic and how it has become a permanent part of their daily routines.

TAKING ON TRANSITIONS

Panelists will discuss the various "endings" we face in our lifetime, whether they be expected or not. They will talk abouts the challenges leading up to these endings: including, outgrowing your surroundings, dealing with disagreement from others towards your choices, and even the fear you may have about ending a chapter in your life. Instead of letting fear hold you back, you will learn how to approach transitions positively and cultivate resilience. Panelists will teach you different practices towards building a mindset that subconsciously prepares you for any change or ending you may encounter.

DEFINING SUCCESS

This panel will discuss aligning your career with your values, identifying your non-negotiables, and investing in strategic assets to maximize your efficiency while at work. Panelists will also share how they created their ideas of success, transitioned out of careers that no longer aligned with their goals, and worked towards reinventing themselves.

GENDER REPRESENTATION IN THE WORKPLACE: BRINGING MORE SEATS TO THE TABLE

This panel aims at celebrating women and highlighting the importance of gender representation in the workplace. Speakers and attendees will discuss issues faced with identifying as a woman in the workplace, including the concepts of equal pay, gender bias, phrases used against women, and more. We will discuss how women can support other women in the workplace, and how others can act as allies in a multitude of settings.


Smart Woman Securities (SWS) n.
